### 1) A BILL TO REPEAL OBAMACARE

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1. **SECTION 1.** The Affordable Care Act is hereby repealed with the following
- **2.** Exceptions.
- 3. SECTION 2.
  - **A**. Sections 1201 subsection 2704, dealing with pre existing conditions.
  - **B.** Section 2714, which enables individuals to stay on their parents plan until the Age of 26 years old.
- **4. SECTION 3.** This bill will be enforced by The Department of Health and Human
- **5.** Services.
- **6. SECTION 4.** This bill shall take effect immediately.
- 7. SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null
- **8.** And void.

# 2) A Bill to End the Militarization of Local Police

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1. SECTION 1. All federal programs and grants that assist local police in obtaining
- 2. Automatic or semi-automatic weapons or APC's shall no longer be allowed to do so.
- 3. SECTION 2. Federal programs and grants that assist local police in obtaining automatic
- 4. Or semi-automatic weapons or APC's include but are not limited to the 1033 Program
- **5.** And the Department of Justice's Byrne JAG Grant Program.
- **6.** APC's are defined as Armored Personnel Carriers.

- 7. This bill will not apply to local SWAT teams.
- 8. "SWAT Teams" shall be defined as a group of elite police marksmen who specialize in
- 9. High-risk tasks.
- 10. SECTION 3. The Department of Justice, Department of Defense, and Department of
- 11. Homeland Security shall work together in implementing, enforcing, and abiding by this
- **12.** Legislation.
- 13. Federal agencies that don't comply with this legislation shall lose 25% of their federal
- 14. Funding.
- **15. SECTION 4.** This legislation shall take effect on January 1, 2015.
- **16. SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

### 3) A Bill to Remove All Corn Subsidies

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1. **SECTION 1:** The United States government shall hereby remove all current and

- 3. **SECTION 2:** "Subsidies" shall be defined as a sum of money granted by the
- 4. United States government to help a certain business or industry so that the price of
- 5. Their goods or service remains competitive.
- **6. SECTION 3:** The Department of Agriculture and the Department of the Treasury
- 7. Shall oversee this bill.
- **8. SECTION 4:** This legislation shall take into effect immediately.
- 9. **SECTION 5:** All laws in conflict with this legislation are declared null and void.

### 4) The Egyptian Funding Act of 2015

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 3. SECTION 2: The United States will also remove our embassy in the region due
- **4.** To a lack of stability in the region.
- **5. SECTION 3:** The United States Congress shall have the power to enforce this
- **6.** With appropriate legislation.
- 7. **SECTION 4:** The money removed shall be directly allocated evenly into the
- **8.** Current Education budget and improving our infrastructure system.
- 9. SECTION 5: The remaining 25% of funding will be used for counter-terrorism
- **10.** Efforts and relief efforts within Egypt.
- 11. SECTION 6: This bill will become official when the United States Congress
- **12.** Passes the 2015 budget.
- **13. SECTION 7:** Any laws in conflict with this bill shall be declared null and void.

### 5) The Affordable College Act of 2016

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1. **SECTION 1:** The United States government will hereby fund all tuitions for
- 2. Public colleges and universities so that it is free to all students who wish to go.
- 3. SECTION 2: "Public colleges and universities" shall be defined as colleges or
- **4.** Universities currently receiving funding from the state or federal governments.
- 5. SECTION 3: Room and board, for all students who wish to explore this option,
- **6.** Will still be charged to students and at the current rates that colleges have them at.
- 7. SECTION 4: "Room and board" shall be defined as any student of a college or
- **8.** University living on campus and their living expenses.
- 9. **SECTION 5:** The United States government shall receive all necessary funding
- 10. From a .1% tax increase on American citizens and with money that was
- 11. Previously used for student aid and federal loans.
- **12. SECTION 6:** The Department of Education shall oversee this bill.
- **13. SECTION 7:** This bill shall go into effect on January 1st, 2016.
- **14. SECTION 8:** The delay is set so that the United States government has the
- **15.** Necessary time to gain the required funding for this bill.
- **16. SECTION 9:** All laws in conflict with this bill shall be declared null and void.

### 6) A Bill to Privatize Amtrak

- 7. Investor to purchase the services of Amtrak.
- **8. SECTION 5:** All laws in conflict with this bill shall be declared null and void.

# 7) The States Rights Act

- 3. Section 2: Citizens of American Samoa and Puerto Rico will have the opportunity
- 4. To vote on statehood in November 4, 2016. Statehood is the recognition by the
- 5. Federal government that a region is a US state and that the constitution is fully
- **6.** Applicable to a region.
- 7. Section 3: The Federal Election Committee (FEC) would enforce this bill.
- **8. Section 4:** The bill shall be made effective November 4, 2016.
- Section 5: All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

### 8) The Sustainable Diet Act

- 7. Animals and select cuts of meat. Horse farms would be under the same
- **8.** Regulations as beef farms, and the butchers would follow the same standards for
- **9.** The preparation of internal organs as for any other cut of meat.
- 10. Section 3: The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) would enforce
- 11. This bill.
- **12. Section 4:** The bill shall be made effective January 1, 2015.
- 13. Section 5: All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and
- **14.** Void.

# 9) International War Crime Prosecution Act

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 10. Section 3: United States Agency for International Development shall oversee the
- 11. Termination of international spending on Israel.
- **12. Section 4:** The bill shall be made effective November 1, 2014.
- **13. Section 5:** All laws in conflict with this legislation are declared null and void.

### 10) The Chained CPI Act of 2014

- **3.** Labor as a measure of inflation.
- 4. SECTION 2. This legislation shall be enforced by the Secretaries of Labor and
- 5. Health and Human Services
- **6. SECTION 3.** This legislation shall take effect on October 1, 2015.
- 7. **SECTION 4.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null
- **8.** And void.

- 7. tax shall be placed on all organ sales within the first year of implementation with
- **8.** a review period of afterward to increase as needed up to 10%.
- **9. SECTION 4.** This law shall take effect January 1, 2015.
- 10. SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null
- 11. and void.

### 13) A Bill to Regulate E-Cigarettes

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- **2. SECTION 1**. E-Cigarettes will be classified under the Federal Drug Admission's regulation for tobacco and cigarettes.
- **3. SECTION 2**. The regulation for tobacco and cigarettes includes, but is not limited to:
  - A. The Federal Cigarette Labeling and Advertising Act of 1965
  - **B.** The Public Health Cigarette Smoking Act of 1970
  - C. Tobacco Control Act of 2009
- **4. SECTION 3.** The Federal Drug Administration as well as the Department of Health will be responsible for the enforcement of this bill.
- **5. SECTION 4.** This law will take effect by January 2015.
- **6. SECTION 5.** All other laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
- 7. Introduced for Congressional Debate by the San Fran Bay District.

## 14) The Get Young America Working Act

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2. SECTION 1. The United States hereby adopts a policy that will push the
- 3. minimum wage for teenagers to 20% below the standard minimum wage.
- 4. SECTION 2. A teenager is defined as any person between and including the ages
- **5.** of 13-19.
- **6. SECTION 3.** The intention of this legislation is to encourage businesses to
- 7. employ young Americans. While the minimum wage is 20% lower than the
- **8.** standard federal minimum wage applied to persons 20 and over, it is not a
- 9. mandate requiring that businesses pay the minimum. Wages paid to teenagers
- **10.** shall not be lower than 20% of the standard federal minimum wage.
- 11. SECTION 4. The Wage and Hour Division of the Department of Labor shall
- **12.** oversee the administration of this legislation.

- **13. SECTION 5.** This law will take effect January 1, 2016.
- **14. SECTION 6.** Current exemptions to minimum wage laws (e.g. food services,
- 15. hospitality, etc.) will be unaffected by this legislation. All laws in conflict with
- **16.** this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

# 15) A Resolution to Recognize the Republic of China

- 1. WHEREAS, The people and state of Taiwan have an inherent right to self-
- 2. governance; and
- 3. WHEREAS, China's increasing apprehension toward Taiwanese autonomy is
- 4. dangerous to the region; and
- 5. WHEREAS, This has stifled Taiwanese development; now, therefore, be it
- 6. **RESOLVED,** That Taiwan, hereby referred to as the Republic of China, will be
- 7. recognized as a sovereign nation, independent of the People's Republic of China;
- 8. and, be it
- 9. **FURTHER RESOLVED,** That the Departments of State, Defense, and the
- 10. Treasury are hereby authorized to conduct bilateral diplomatic, military, and
- 11. economic relations with the Republic of China.
