## 1) A Bill to Ensure the Voting Rights of Convicted Felons

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1. SECTION 1. No state or the District of Columbia may prohibit felons who have completed their
- 2. sentence, parole, and probation from participating in elections.
- 3. SECTION 2. A felon shall be defined as an individual who has committed a felony.
- 4. Although the definition of a felony may vary from state to state, the general definition of a
- 5. felony shall remain as a crime more serious than a misdemeanor.
- 6. SECTION 3. The United States Election Assistance Commission shall enforce this law.
- 7. SECTION 4. The bill shall be made effective December 1st 2017
- 8. SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

- 10. SECTION 6: This piece of legislation shall be made effective on July 1, 2017
- 11. SECTION 7: All laws and Supreme Court rulings in conflict with this legislation are hereby
- 12. declared null and void.

- 10. SECTION 7: All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## 7) A BILL TO BAN PRIVATE PRISONS

- **8. SECTION 4**. This legislation will go into effect immediately.

# 8) The Compassionate Access, Research Expansion, and Respect States Act

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1. SECTION 1. The United States government shall allow states to set their own medical

2. marijuana policies.

- 3. SECTION 2. The government shall reclassify marijuana as a Schedule 2 drug in the Drug
- 4. Enforcement Agency's five category drug classification system.
- 5. SECTION 3. The U.S. shall remove the CBD strains, used to treat epilepsy and seizure
- 6. disorders, from the federal definition of marijuana.
- 7. SECTION 4. The federal government shall allow doctors working for the Department of
- 8. Veterans Affairs in states where medical marijuana is legal to recommend it for certain
- 9. condition.
- 10. SECTION 5. The government shall permit financial services and banking for marijuana

11. dispensaries.

12. SECTION 6. Public or private research that sanctioned by the government shall be

13. exempted from federal criminal laws concerning the use or possession of marijuana.

14. SECTION 7. The Drug Enforcement Agency shall oversee the implementation of this bill.

**15. SECTION 8.** This law shall go into effect on January 1, 2017.

## 9) Establish a National Infrastructure Bank

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1. SECTION 1. The United States shall establish a National Infrastructure Bank as a government

2. corporation with the task of investing in transportation, environmental, energy and

**3.** telecommunications projects.

4. SECTION 2. All members of the National Infrastructure Bank will be appointed by the

5. President of the United States, with the advice and consent of the Senate.

6. SECTION 3. A nine member Executive Committee of the Bank shall be created. This

7. committee will establish requirements and make recommendations for project proposals to be

8. considered for financial assistance.

9. SECTION 4. A five member Board of Directors of the Bank shall be created. This board will be

10. responsible for monitoring and overseeing energy, environmental, telecommunications, and

11. transportation infrastructure projects.

12. SECTION 5. Five years after the formation of the bank, the General Accountability Office will13. be directed to assess the impact and benefits of each funded project.

14. SECTION 6. After the Executive Committee and Board of Directors pick projects with solid

**15.** revenue potential, private investors will be compelled to invest in the bank.

16. SECTION 7. The bank will supplement other federal infrastructure programs by providing

17. loans, loan guarantees and proceeds from bond issuances for projects, and make payments to

**18.** help states and localities cover their bond interest payments.

19. SECTION 8. To pay for the \$25 billion dollar bank, the overseas tax loophole, relating to20. multinational corporations, will be closed. Those corporations will be taxed at the same rates21. they are taxed at in the United States. The rest of the money generated from closing the loophole

**22.** will go to reducing the national debt.

23. SECTION 9. The Department of Transportation, Department of the Treasury, and the IRS will24. oversee the enforcement of this bill.

**25. SECTION 10.** This law shall take effect on January 1, 2017.

## 10) A BILL TO BAN DRILLING AND HYDRAULIC FRACKING IN NATIONAL PARKS

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1. SECTION 1. All drilling and hydraulic fracturing, or "fracking," will be banned

2. indefinitely on land designated as "national parkland" within the United States, and licenses

**3.** allowing fracking will be suspended immediately.

4. SECTION 2. A. "Hydraulic Fracturing" is a technique that injects a mixture of water, sand

5. and chemicals into the ground under high pressure to crack rock and allow trapped natural

6. gas and oil to flow.

7. SECTION 2. B. "National Parkland" is any land designated as such by the National Park

8. Service and the United States Department of the Interior.

9. SECTION 3. Oversight of this falls under the joint control of the United States

10. Environmental Protection Agency, United States Department of the Interior, and United

11. States Department of Homeland Security. Any company found drilling or fracking will be

**12.** fined \$2 million per offense.

13. SECTION 4. This legislation shall go into effect February 1, 2016.

14. SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## 11) A Bill to Reduce Gun Violence

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1. SECTION 1. The United States shall amend the federal criminal code to make it a crime to

2. knowingly import, sell, manufacture, transfer, or possess a semiautomatic assault weapon or

3. large capacity ammunition feeding device (H.R. 4269, 114<sup>th</sup> Congress).

4. SECTION 2. A semiautomatic assault weapon utilizes a portion of the energy of a firing

5. cartridge to extract the fired cartridge case and chamber the next round and requires a separate

6. pull of the trigger to fire each cartridge. A large capacity ammunition feeding device is a

7. magazine, belt, drum, feed strip, or similar device, including any such device joined or coupled

8. with another in any manner, that has an overall capacity of, or that can be readily restored,

9. changed, or converted to accept, more than 10 rounds of ammunition; and does not include an

10. attached tubular device designed to accept, and capable of operating only with .22 caliber rimfire11. ammunition.

12. SECTION 3. The Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms will oversee the enforcement of13. the bill.

14. SECTION 4. This law shall go into effect on January 1, 2017.

# 12) A Bill to Provide Funding to Public Schools to Implement Programs for Learning Native Languages BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1. SECTION 1: The federal government shall provide funds to each state for the

2. Purpose of implementing courses teaching students in public schools Native Languages.

- 3. SECTION 2: Native languages shall be defined as languages spoken by the Native
- 4. American tribes as listed by the Bureau of Indian Affairs.
- 5. SECTION 3: This legislation shall be overseen by the Department of Education
- 6. And The Bureau of Indian Affairs.
  - A. During the first year of implementation, \$40 million dollars shall be divided between each state. After the first year, \$10 million dollars will be allocated each year towards improving and continuing these language programs.
  - B. The Bureau of Education shall determine how much of the \$40 million and \$10 million dollars each state shall receive based on three factors; first, the presence or lack thereof of language programs teaching native languages in the state, population of native tribes in the area of the state, as well as the level of danger the native languages in that area are to dying out.
  - **C.** Schools with large populations of Native Americans, as determined by the Bureau of Indian Affairs, will be given priority for the funding.
  - D. To pay for the initial cost as well as the recurring annual costs, sales at all casinos shall be taxed at 1% the first year, 0.5% the second year, and shall be adjusted for inflation each recurring year as determined by the Internal Revenue Service based on the projected revenue for the casino industry each year.
  - **E.** Each year the Department of Education shall require proof from each state that the funds allocated have been used for their intended purpose. If this is found not to have been the case, the state will not receive these funds for a period of no less than one year.
- 7. SECTION 4: This legislation shall be implemented by January 1, 2018.

8. RESOLVED, That there be an investigation launched to determine whether or not

9. their aid is being used responsibly; and, be it

10. FURTHER RESOLVED, That if the aid is found to not be used for its intended purpose, some
