1) A RESOLUTION TO CUT AID TO PAKISTAN

- 1. WHEREAS, the U.S. has given Pakistan almost \$2 billion USD in foreign aid and,
- 2. WHEREAS, the United States has deployed more drones for warfare in Pakistan
- 3. than in any other country,
- **4. WHEREAS**, the military in Pakistan may have formed an alliance with ISIS;
- 5. Therefore be it **RESOLVED**, By the Congress here assembled work to terminate
- **6.** military aid and weapons sales to the nation of Pakistan.

2) A Bill to Abandon the "One China Policy"

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1. **SECTION 1:** The State Department is hereby ordered to re-establish diplomatic
- 2. relations with the Republic of China henceforth be known as Taiwan.
- 3. **SECTION 2:** The U.S. Embassy shall be erected in Taipei with a construction budget
- 4. of \$1 million USD.
- **5. SECTION 3:** U.S. Military personnel shall be stationed in Taipei to supervise the transition.
- **6. SECTION 4:** The Department of Defense and State Department shall oversee this
- 7. piece of legislation
- **8. SECTION 5:** This legislation shall be made effective January 28, 2020.
- **9. SECTION 6:** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

3) A Resolution to Ban State-Run Lotteries

- 1. WHEREAS, The lottery is addictive and can contribute to gambling problems;
- **2. WHEREAS**, The lottery disproportionally targets the poor;
- 3. WHEREAS, and Governments should not be in the business of gambling
- **4.** WHEREAS, States have not used revenue from lottery games responsibly and lottery money
- **5.** does not really benefit education;
- **6. RESOLVED,** That the United States Congress look for ways to ban state-run lotteries.

4) A Bill to Re-impose the Arms Embargo on Bahrain

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1. SECTION 1. The United States government is prohibited from selling or transferring tear
- 2. gas, small arms, light weapons, ammunition for small arms and light weapons, humvees, and
- 3. other weapons used for crowd control to Bahrain until the Department of State certifies that
- 4. Bahrain has fully implemented all 26 recommendations set forth in the 2011 Bahrain
- **5.** Independent Commission of Inquiry report.
- **6. SECTION 2**. The 2011 Bahrain Independent Commission of Inquiry report listed
- 7. recommendations to help the country of Bahrain improve its human rights record.
- **8. SECTION 3.** The Department of State will oversee the enforcement of this bill.
 - **A.** Within a year of this legislation's passage, the State Department will report to Congress if Bahrain has met all 26 BICI recommendations.
- **9. SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on July 1, 2017.
- 10. SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

5) A Resolution to Encourage NATO to Remove U.S. Nukes from Turkey

- 1. WHEREAS, The United States currently has nuclear weapons in Turkey that are being put
- 2. at risk, as the country is unstable, and
- 3. WHEREAS, The nuclear weapons serve no strategic purpose, because both the U.S. and
- 4. Turkey don't have certified aircraft to carry the weapons, and
- **5.** WHEREAS, Keeping the nukes in Turkey could greatly harm the security of the U.S. and
- **6.** the world, and
- 7. **RESOLVED**, That the Congress here assembled recommend to NATO that they remove
- **8.** U.S. nukes from Turkey.

6) A Bill to Preserve the Security of the American Power Grid BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1. SECTION 1. A sum of two billion dollars will be appropriated towards strengthening the
- 2. nation's power grid to minimize the damage from any source of electromagnetic pulse.
- 3. SECTION 2A. "Electromagnetic pulse" will be defined as a short burst of electromagnetic
- 4. energy that can arise from a variety of sources, such as lightning strikes, nuclear explosions,
- **5.** or solar storms.
- **6. SECTION 2B**. "Solar storm" will be defined as an eruption of magnetically charged
- 7. plasma from the sun's interior into space.
- **8. SECTION 3.** Funding for this legislation will be taken from the U.S. Department of
- **9.** Energy, which will oversee the implementation of this bill.
- **10. SECTION 4.** This law shall take effect immediately upon passage.
- 11. SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

7) A Bill to Ban the Online Sale of Flamethrowers

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1. SECTION 1. The XM42 and the X15 models of flamethrowers, as manufactured by the
- 2. company *XMatter*, as well as any other handheld flamethrower, shall be banned from being
- **3.** purchased via online sales.
- **4. SECTION 2A.** "Flamethrowers" shall be defined as a weapon that sprays out burning fuel.
- 5. SECTION 2B. "Online sales" shall be defined as the purchase of goods and services through
- **6.** the internet.
- 7. **SECTION 3.** The Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms and the Department of Justice
- **8.** shall jointly enforce this legislation.
- **9. SECTION 4.** This legislation shall go into effect immediately upon passage.
- **10. SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

8) A Bill to Arm the Kurds

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1. SECTION 1. The US shall hereby supply \$1.5 billion in arms, ammunition, military vehicles,
- 2. and maintenance supplies for armored vehicles to the Iraqi Kurds' peshmerga. Operational
- **3.** and intelligence support will also be provided.
- 4. SECTION 2. The "peshmerga" shall be defined as the armed forces fighting on behalf of the
- 5. Kurdish people in Northern Iraq.
- **6.** SECTION 3. The Department of State and Department of Defense shall oversee the
- 7. enforcement of this legislation.
- **8.** SECTION 4. This law shall go into effect immediately upon passage.
- **9.** SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

9) A Bill to Further Support Millennium Development Goals

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1. SECTION 1. A. The United States shall hereby commit an additional \$2 billion toward
- 2. accomplishing Millennium Development Goal of providing universal access to primary
- **3.** education.
- **4. B.** MDG2 funding shall be redistributed in the following proportions: 50% to Sub-
- 5. Saharan Africa, 20% to Southern Asia, 15% to the Middle East, and 15% to Southeastern
- 6. Asia.
- 7. SECTION 2. A. "Millennium Development Goal 2" shall be defined as the UN objective
- **8.** to achieve universal primary education by the end of 2015.
- 9. B. The nations encompassed by "Sub-Saharan Africa, Southern Asia, the Middle East,
- 10. and Southeastern Asia" have been defined by the United Nations Development
- 11. Programme.
- 12. SECTION 3. The US Agency for International Development shall be in charge of
- **13.** overseeing the enforcement of this legislation.
- **14. SECTION 4.** This law shall go into effect immediately upon passage.
- **15. SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

10) A Bill to Invest in Affordable Higher Education

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1. SECTION 1. \$200 billion will be invested over the next ten years to establish free-to-attend
- 2. community colleges throughout the United States.
- 3. SECTION 2. All publicly owned and operated community colleges in the United States shall
- 4. be required to lift all costs from the students. Those who fail to do so will no longer receive
- **5.** federal funds.
- **6. SECTION 3.** The Federal Department of Education, in cooperation with state Departments
- 7. of Education, shall be responsible for building and maintaining these institutions. The
- 8. Federal Department of Education shall provide annual stipends to state governments based
- **9.** on the quantity and impact of the state's institutions.
- 10. SECTION 4. The provisions of this bill shall take effect immediately upon passage.
- 11. SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
